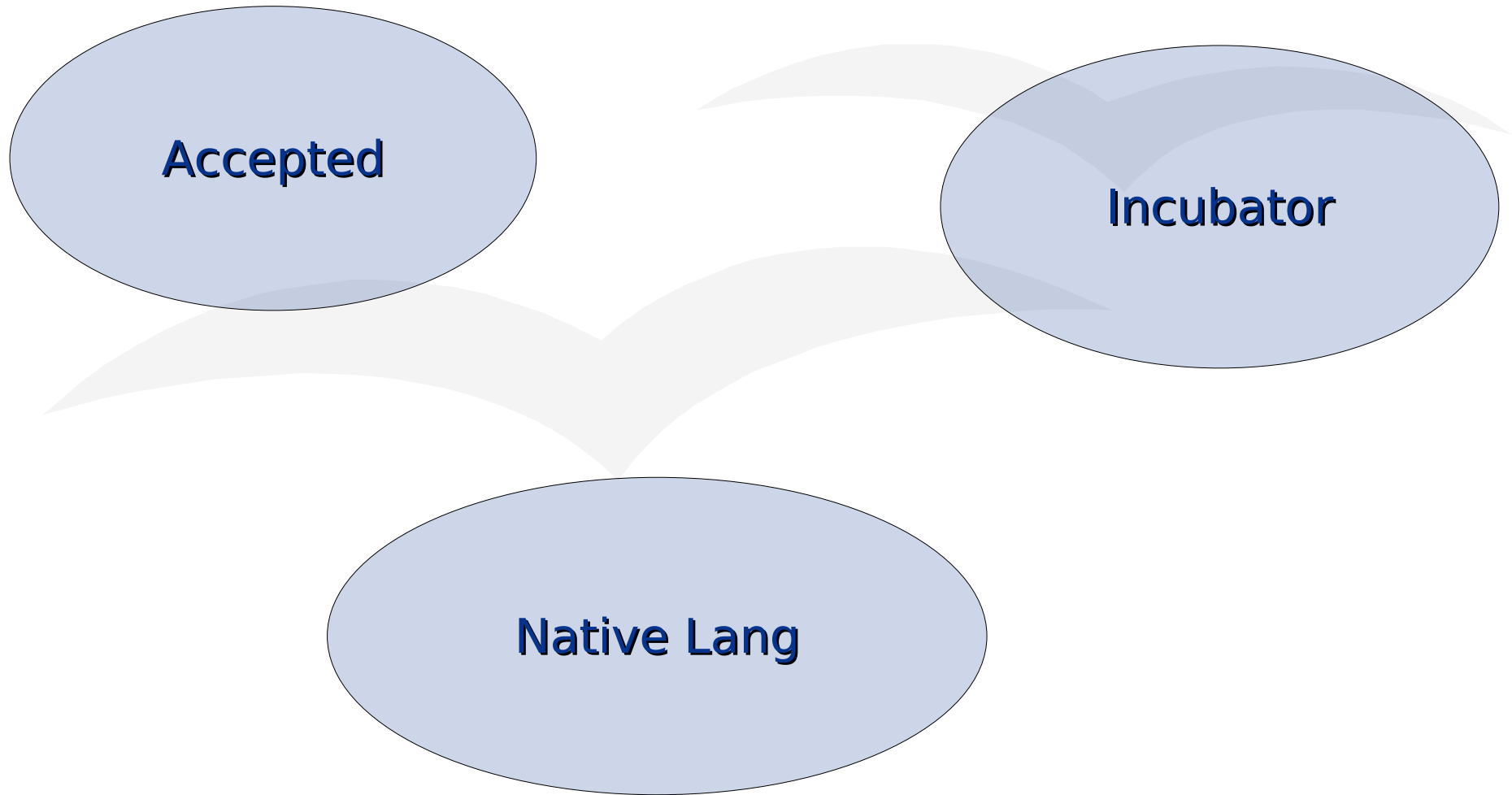

OpenOffice.org - the project

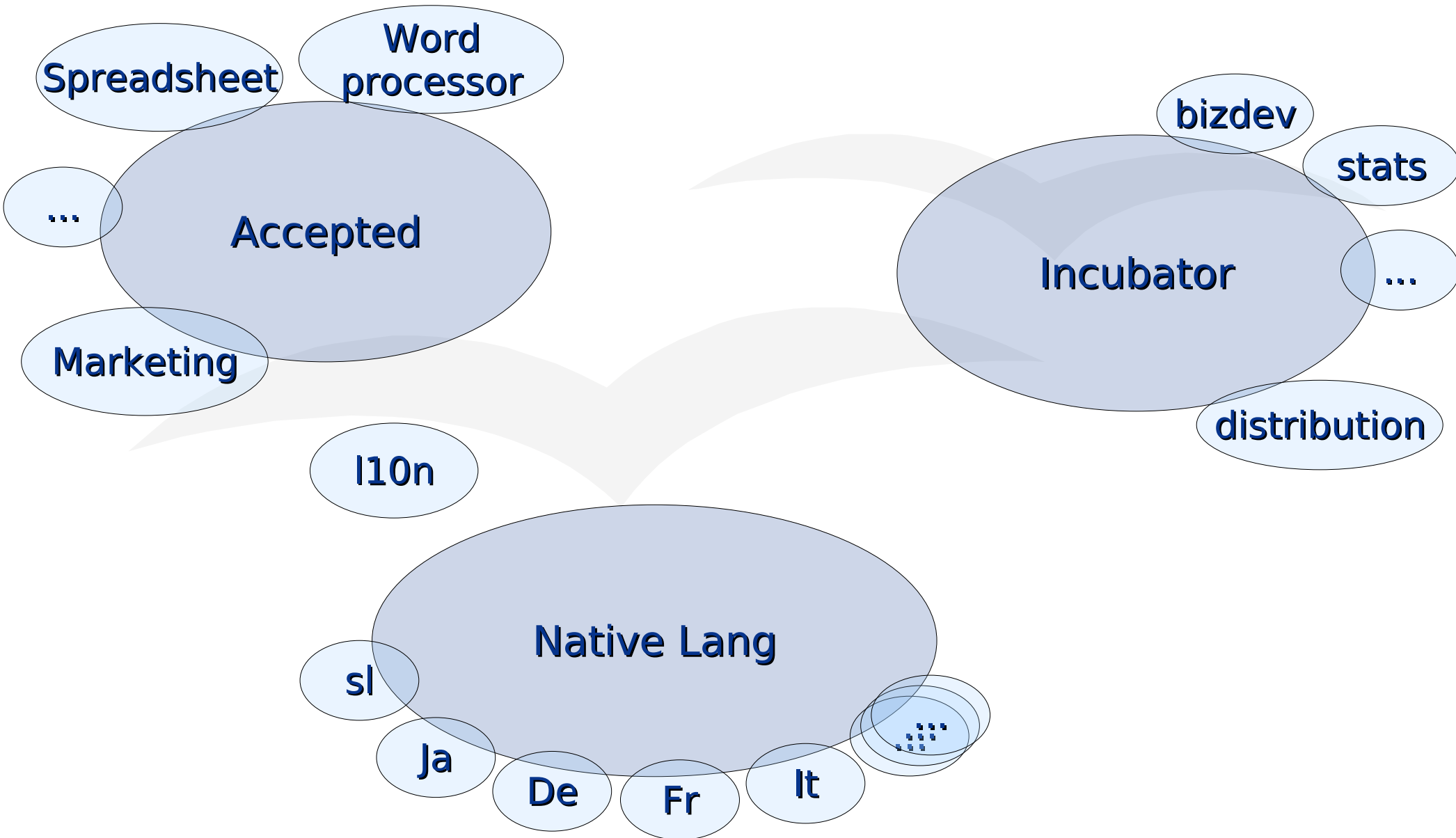
- One of the largest Open Source communities

- OpenOffice.org in numbers:
 - *16.000 subscribers at our mailing lists (without announce lists)*
 - *3.000 posts at mailing lists per week (without automated lists)*
 - *>90 Projects in 3 categories*
 - *>650 people and companies signed the JCA*
- Almost pure Online Community



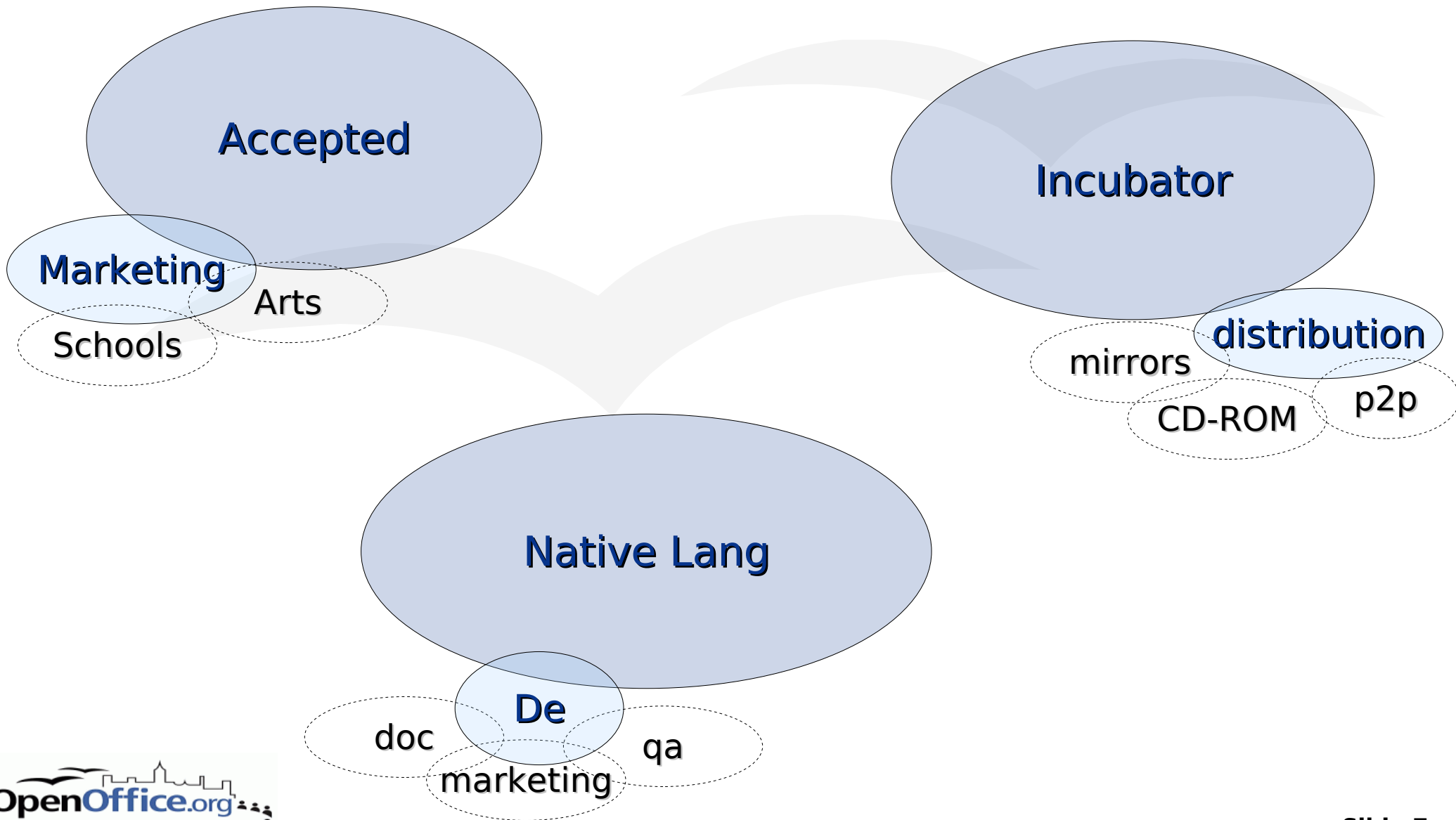
Structure – Project Categories



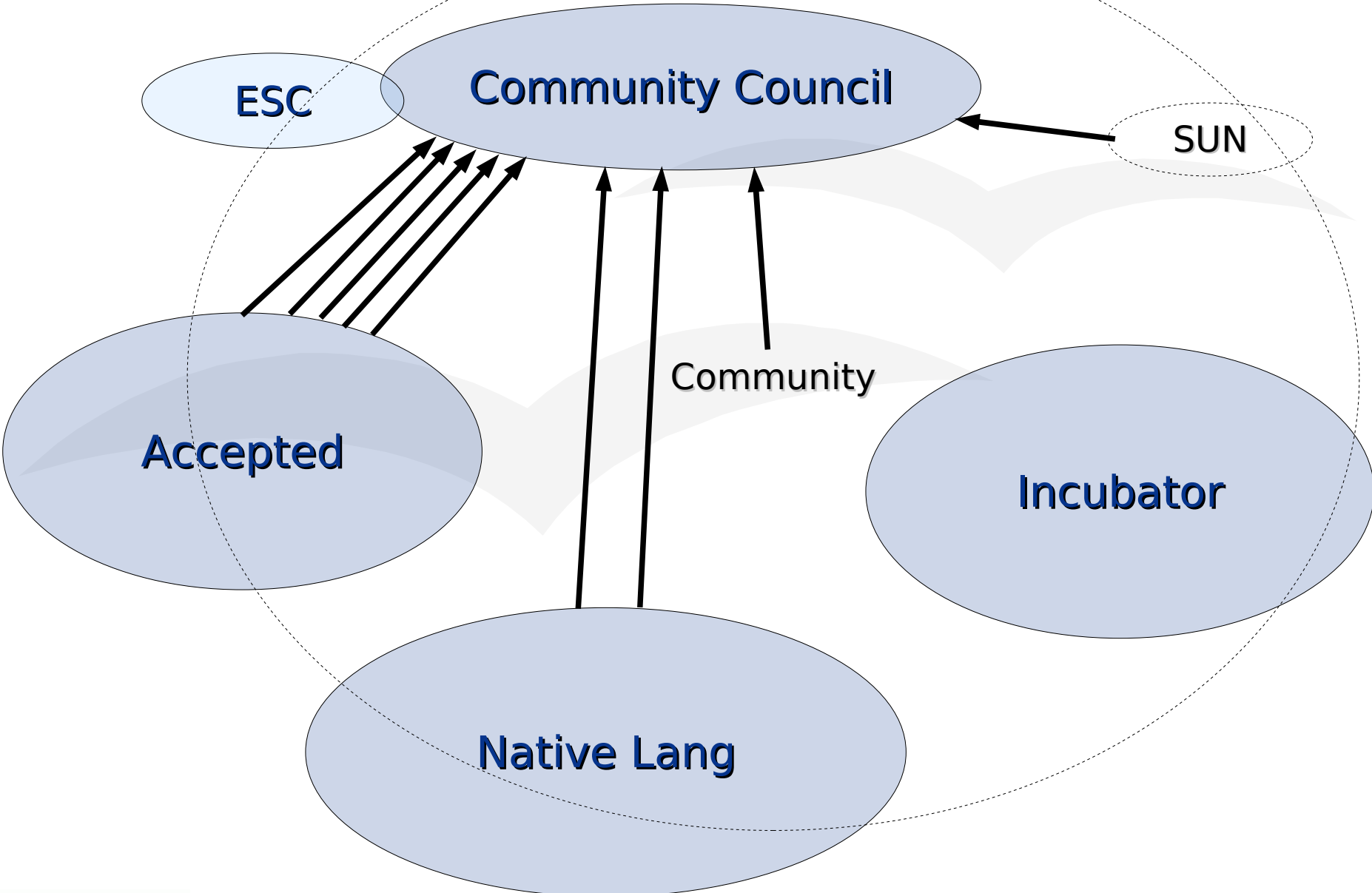
Structure - Projects

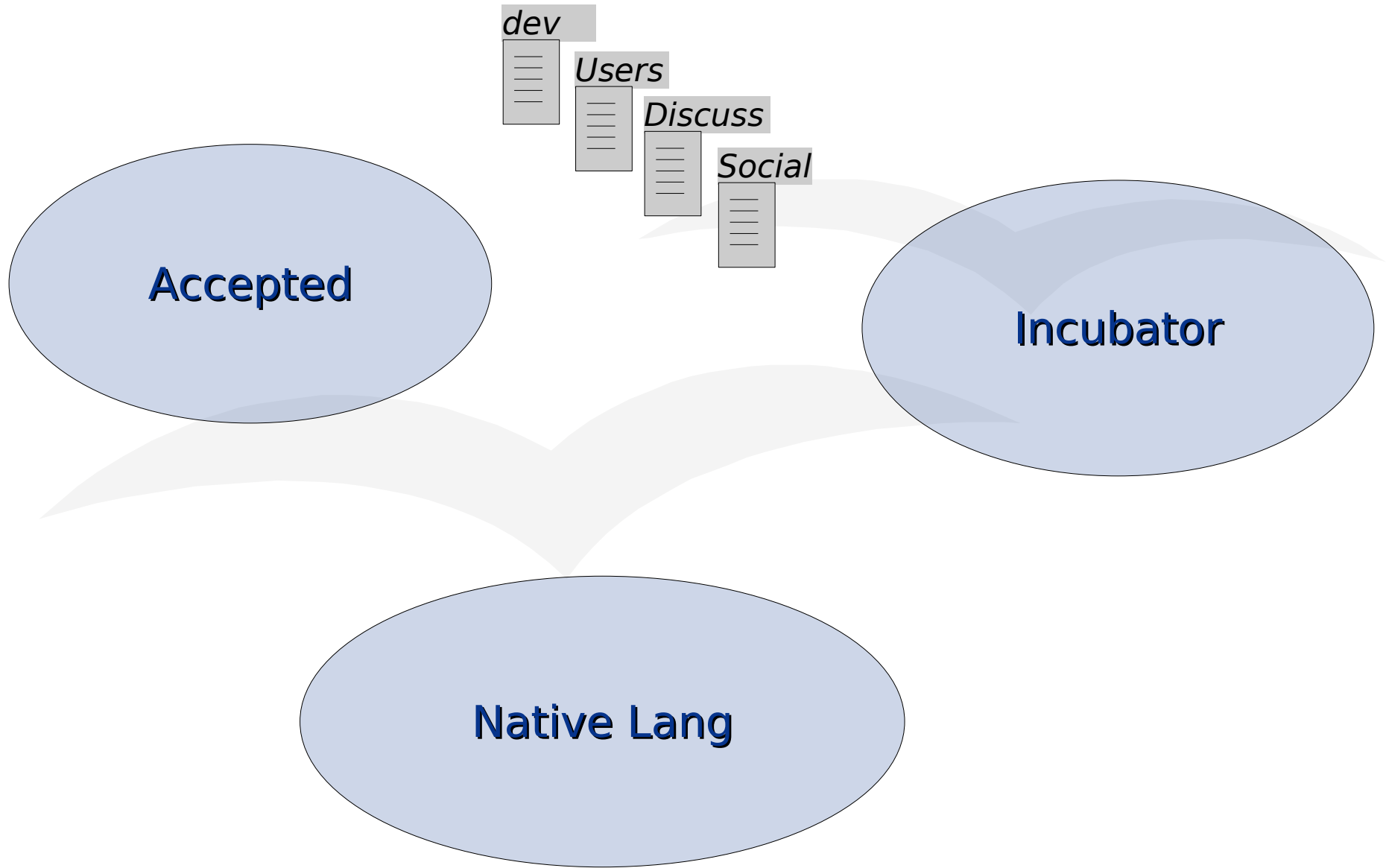




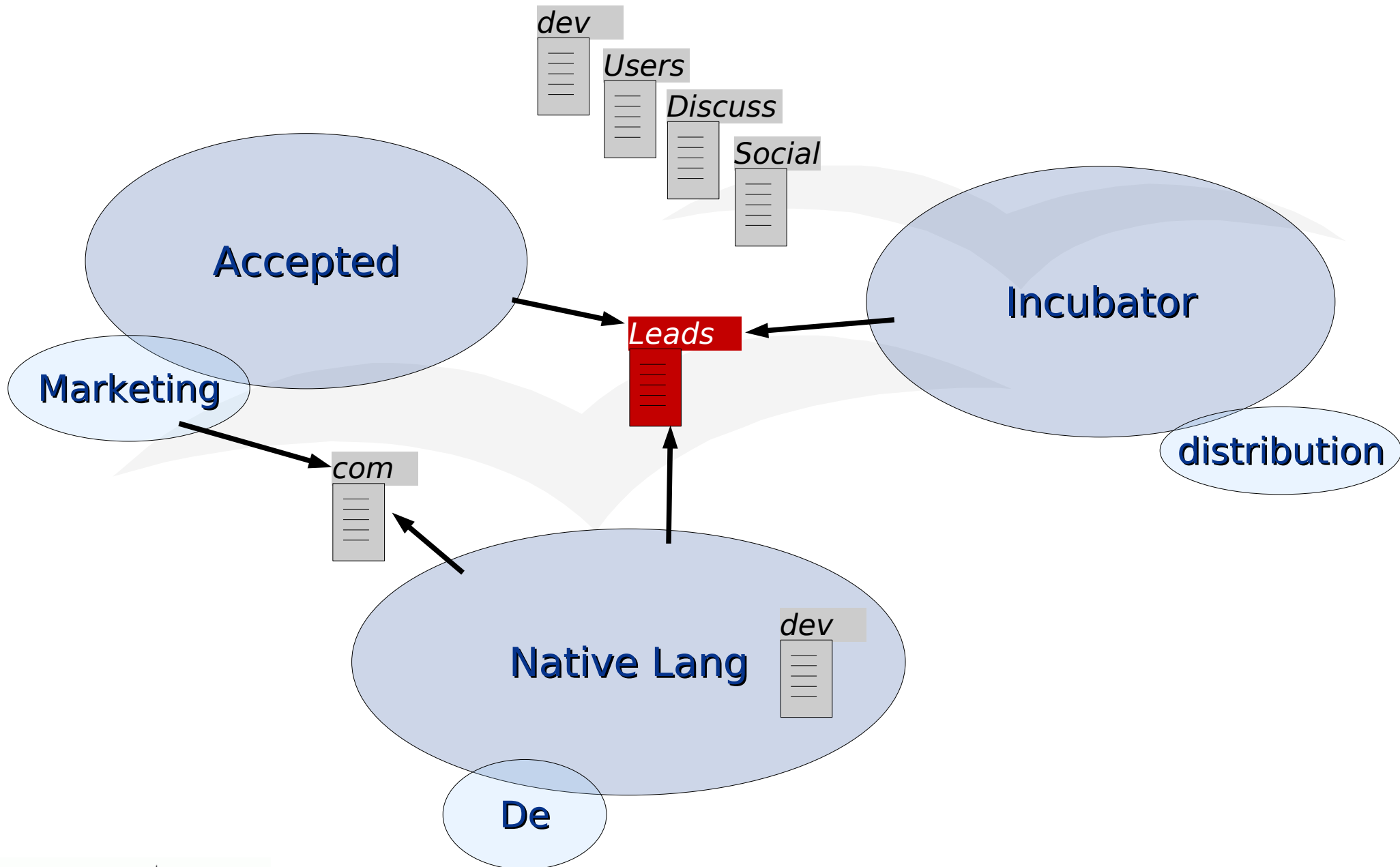

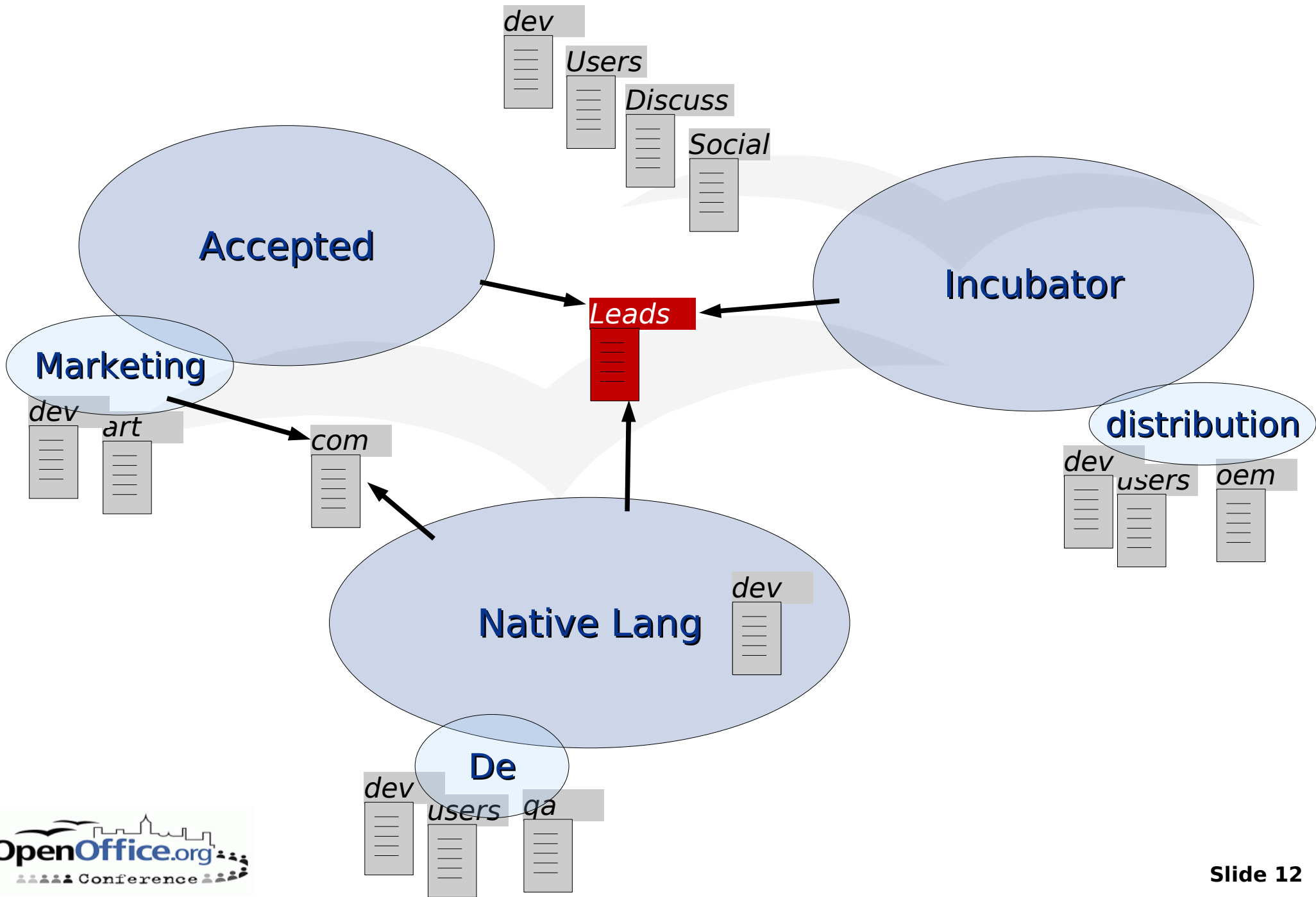
Communication – global lists



Communication – inter project lists

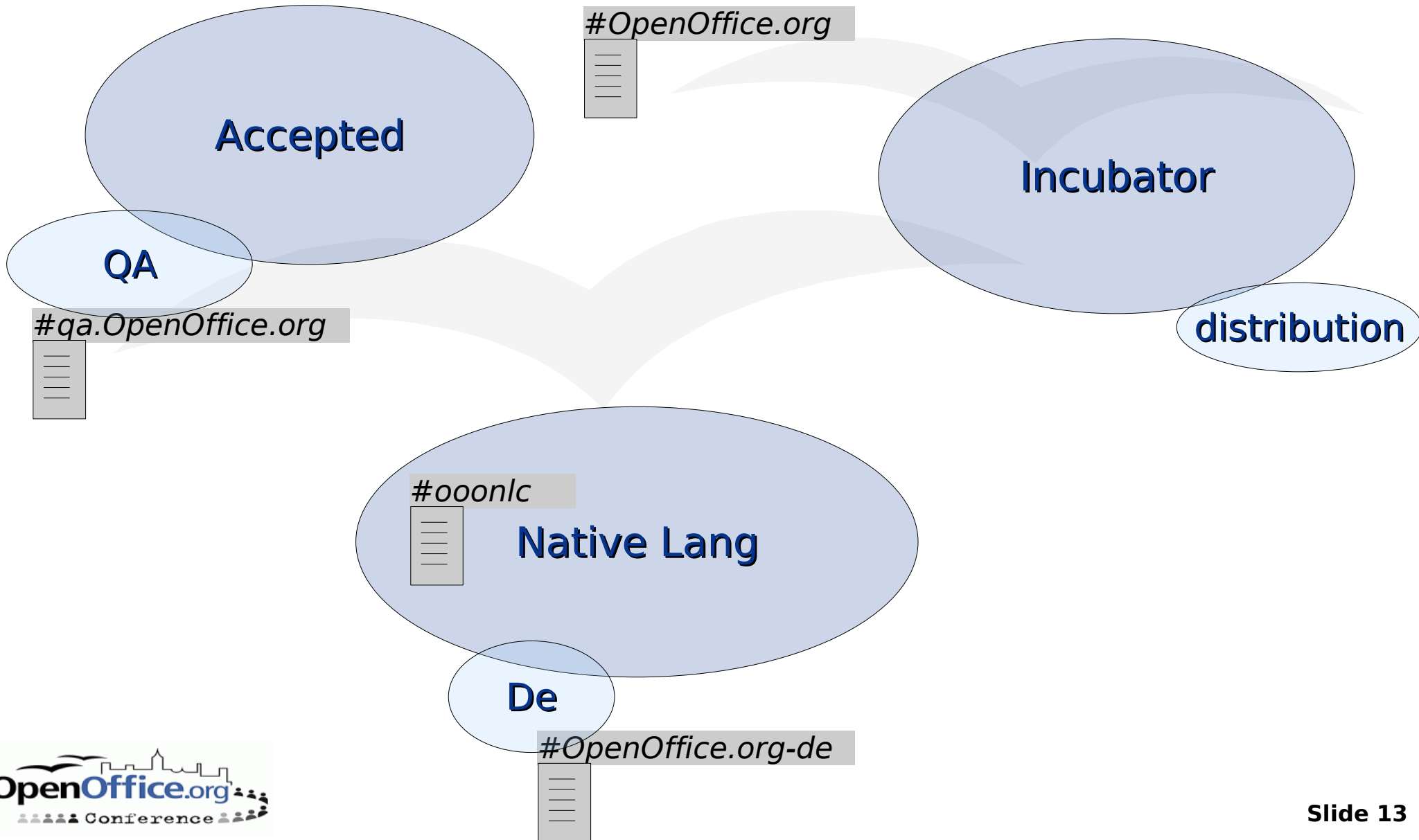


Communication – project lists

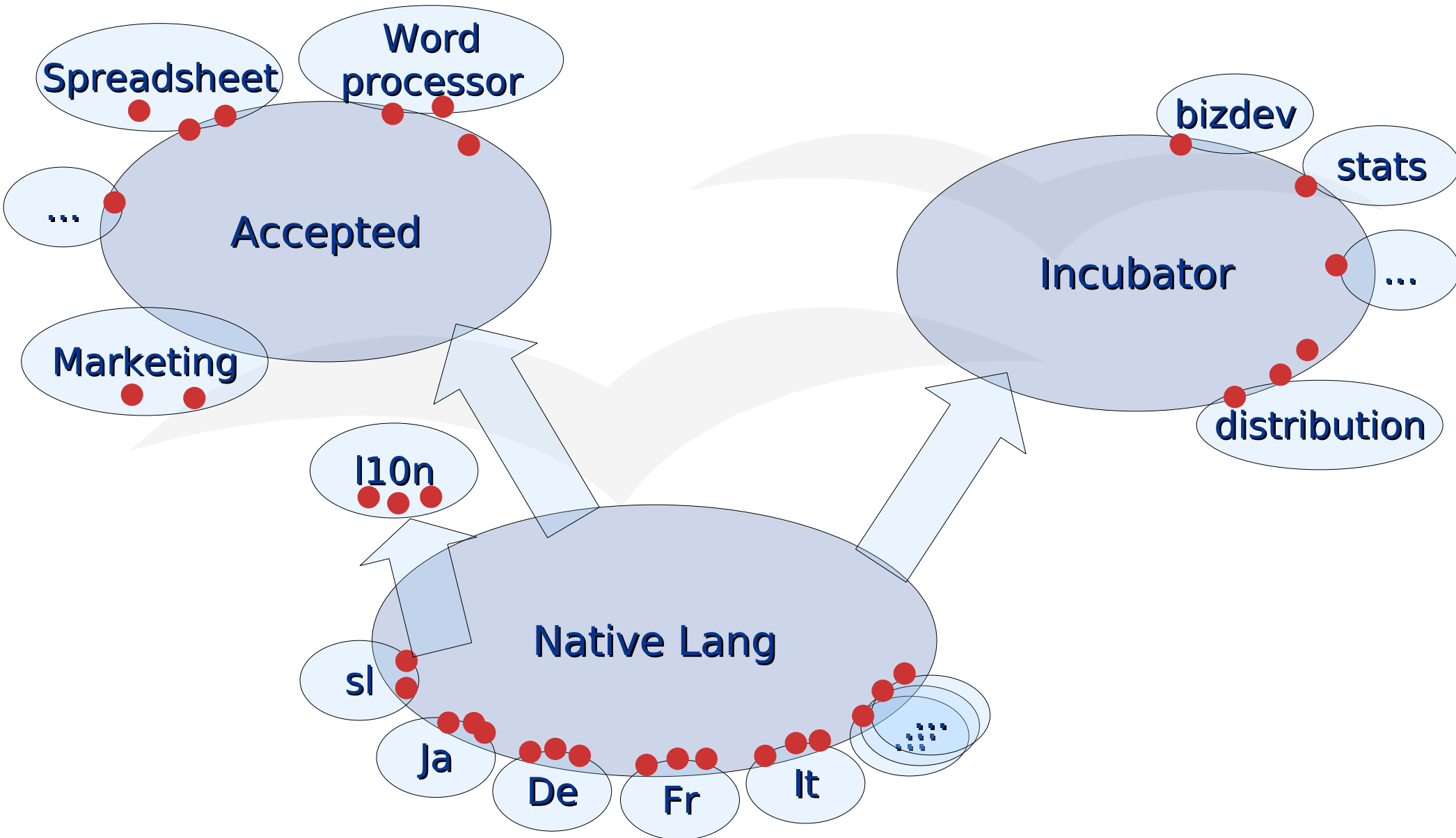




Native Lang Projects - focus

- Your “local point of contact”

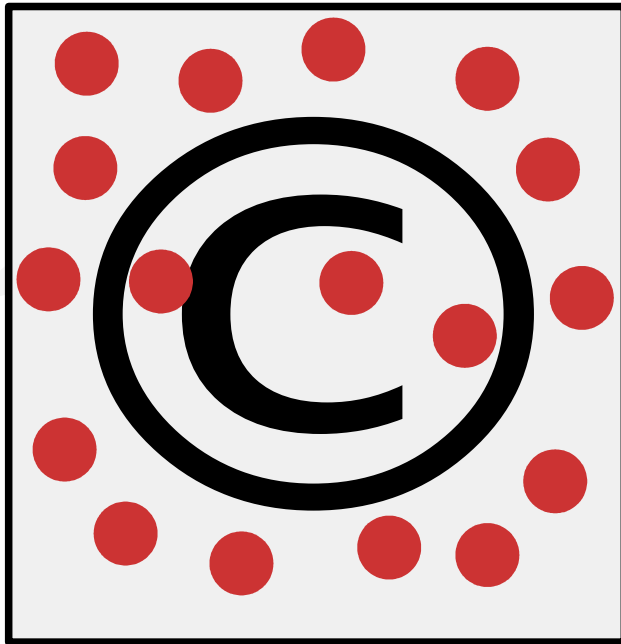

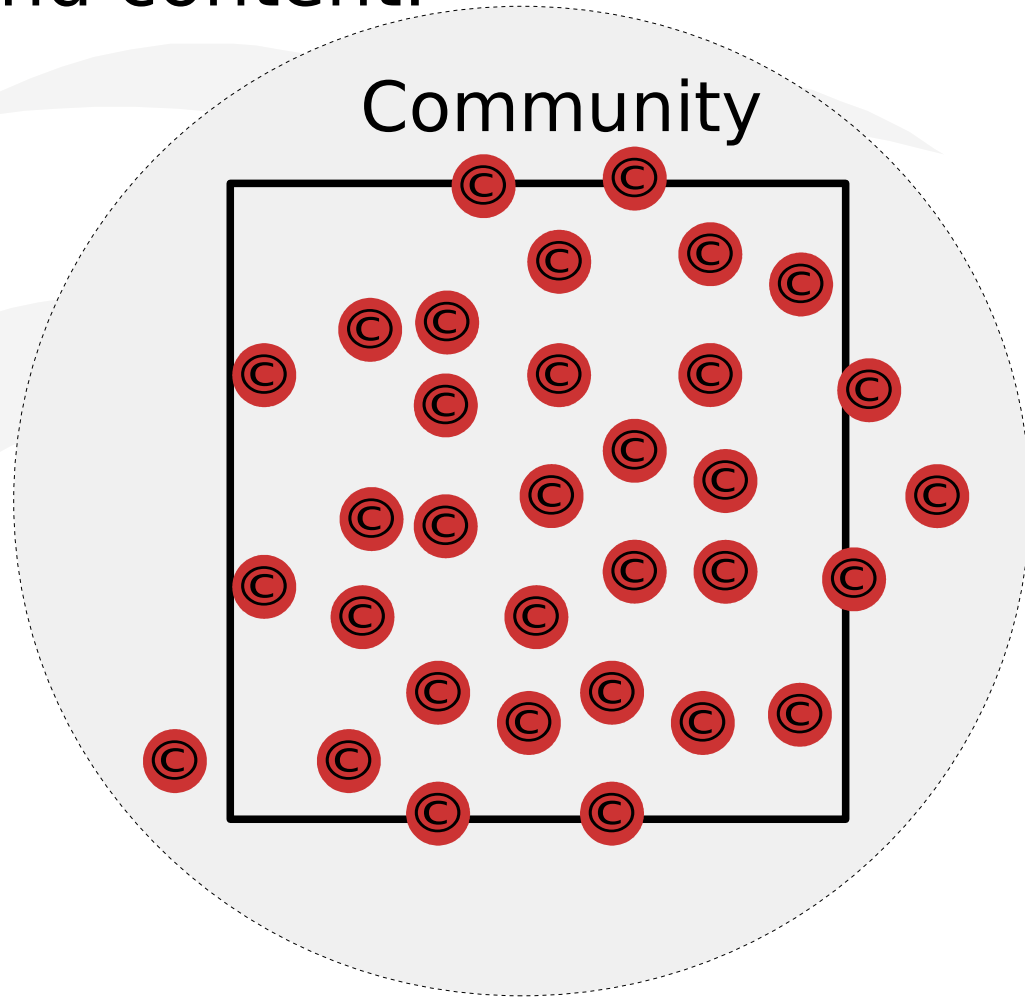
Why are licenses important?

 - ~~*Sun Industry Standard Source License (SISSL)*~~
(dropped for OOo 2.0)
- Documentation
 - *Public Documentation license (PDL)*

- JCA (not a license but an agreement)
